Chairman's Message

Where has the time gone? It has been more than a year since the Board published its newsletter, *The Register*. During this past year, we have traveled a long road. Many of you are aware of the new face of the Board. Before expounding on the Board's new composition, several individuals deserve our recognition and sincere appreciation for their many contributions to the profession.

Clark Gribben, P.E., Civil/Structural, served as Chairman this past year. During Clark's six years on the Board, he brought a tremendous level of expertise in structural engineering. His technical acumen was shared not only on state matters, but also at the national level. The Board fully anticipates drawing upon Clark's structural knowledge in the future.

Rita Lumos, PLS, has Board tenure of nearly 12 years. As Chairman from October 2000 to October 2002, she tirelessly gave of herself to the profession of land surveying, serving on both state and national committees. Rita continues to be active on national committees overseeing surveying licensure.

Dennis Anderson, P.E., was a two-term Board member who offered a strong public agency perspective on civil engineering. A dedicated professional, Dennis exemplifies the qualities desired of all Board members.

Without the commitment of individuals such as Clark, Rita, and Dennis, it would be impossible for the Board to carry out its mission to protect the public's health and safety.

What is the result of Assembly Bill 146? Primarily, the Board composition changed from six engineers and one land surveyor to four engineers, two land surveyors, and one public member. This new composition, effective July 2003, broadens the diversity of perspectives offered by the Board members.

For the first time since its creation in 1919, a non-licensee, public participant is an appointed Board member. Additionally, we now have representation from outside the communities of Las Vegas and Reno. This representation will provide an opportunity for the knowledge of Board activities to extend beyond the professional boundaries.

The new Board membership includes a balance of experienced members and three new faces. Roland Westergard, Vice Chair, James Gardner, and Thomas Krob all bring past experience. Bud Cranor, Thomas Foote, and Dean Neubauer (an Ely resident) are the Board's new faces. Bud is the Board's Public Member, while Tom and Dean bring a wealth of survey experience.

AB 146 also addressed reporting responsibilities of the Board's activities to the State legislature. What prompted AB 146? It initially began as a bill to clarify statutory education requirements for licensure. During the legislative process, concerns were raised on the Board's past responsiveness to both new applicants seeking licensure and existing licensees. The Board must address some definitive issues. We are beginning that process this month.

Some aspects of AB 146, however, are beyond the Board's purview, such as issues involving examinations, which are governed by the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying. We do anticipate a need to address these concerns in the 2005 legislature. As the Board

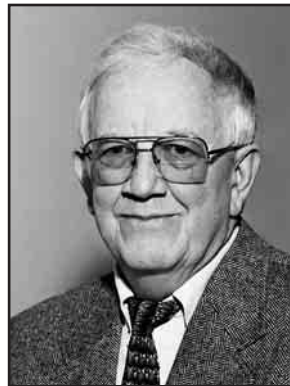

Construction Management - The Role and Responsibilities of the Engineer

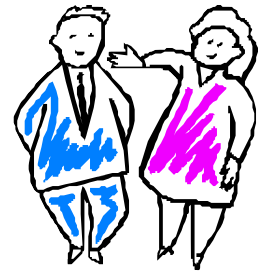
Over the past 12 to 18 months, the issue of whether a licensed professional engineer can perform construction management services has been debated at length. Those involved in the debate include the State Contractors Board, the State Board of Architecture, and the State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors. The debate is a result of conflicts raised during the construction of several projects.

At the heart of the debate is the interpretation of the engineering exemption in NRS Chapter 624, which governs licensed contractors. It is the opinion of the State Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors that the statute does not restrict a professional engineer from performing construction management services, given that the licensed professional engineer has the experience to competently carry out the responsibilities in accordance with the industry standard of care.

The statutes governing the practice of engineering clearly define engineering to include construction management. NRS Chapter 625, Section 050, defines the practice of engineering to include "the responsible supervision of construction."


Consistent with all other professional licensing boards, our sole mission is to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare. We carry out our mission by licensing competent professionals and disciplining those who fail to carry out the responsibilities of a licensed professional.

Examination Changes for 2004

NCEES (National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying) is changing the format and administration of the Structural II exam. These changes begin with the April 2004 exams. The exam format will be to complete four essay problems; two AM problems and two PM problems. The subjects will be buildings or bridges and the four problems you complete will need to be in the same subject area. The whole exam (4 problems) will be graded as one exam. AM and PM will not be graded separately. This means if you fail one part of the exam, or if you passed part of the exam in the past, you will need to retake the entire exam.

New Calculator Policy for April 2004

The Nevada Board will adopt the new NCEES Calculator Policy for the April 2004 exam administration. The policy was announced August 2003 and will prohibit the use of certain calculators in the exam sites. This policy is to address exam security issues with some models that have communicating and/or text-editing capabilities. The banned models currently on the list include: Hewlett Packard - HP 48GX & HP 49; Texas Instrument - TI 83 Plus, TI 83 Plus Silver Edition, TI 89, TI 92, and Voyage 200. The ban may include other models in the future. Contact the Board or review our website periodically to review any changes. STATE BOARD DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

SAM S. ARENTZ, III, MINE 7232: Mr. Arentz acknowledged that he violated NRS 625.520(1)(b) and NRS 625.410(5)(7) when he accepted a Stipulated Agreement on April 5, 2003, that he performed professional engineering services after his license had lapsed. **Fined \$750.00.**

WILLIAM C. ARMSTRONG, CE 7602: Mr. Armstrong entered into a Stipulated Agreement on September 11, 2003, in which he acknowledged that he violated the provisions of NAC 625.510(1), NAC 625.530(1), and NAC 625.615(3). Mr. Armstrong failed to properly communicate with his clients; acted unethically by misleading his clients in regard to the time frames the various projects would be completed; submitted incomplete plans to a governmental agency; and failed to notify the State Board, or his clients, of his current address or manner in which he could be otherwise contacted. **Placed on probation for a period of two years, pay \$1,000 in investigative costs incurred by the Board; must take and successfully complete the Texas Tech University, Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, Basic Studies in Engineering Ethics Correspondence Course within one year; and**

Pay to St. Mary's Coptic Orthodox Church of Las Vegas the sum of \$8,100, which is the cost paid by the Church to the engineer it retained to perform the professional services that Mr. Armstrong had contracted to perform; complete the professional services which he promised to perform on behalf of the Gospel Out Reach Center Ministries and Our Lady of Victory Traditional Catholic Church; and issued a Public Reprimand.

VARTKES "VINNIE" BOURMAIAN, NON-LICENSEE: Mr. Bourmaian was doing business as BC2000 and Bourmaian Consulting. The Board rendered a Decision and Order on February 9, 2003, against Mr. Bourmaian after it was determined that his conduct constituted both an offer to practice and the actual practicing of professional engineering in the State of Nevada without being properly licensed to do so. Such acts violated the provisions of NRS 625.520(1)(a)(1)(3). **Assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$15,000.**

SANDIP KUMAR GUHA, CE 9659: Mr. Guha allowed his license to lapse on June 30, 2001. After this date, he performed engineering services in the State of Nevada after his license lapsed when he stamped and signed submittals made to the Carson City Building Department constituting a violation of NRS 625.565(4) and NRS 652.520. **Assessed an administrative fine of \$ 5,000, and issued a Public Reprimand.**

FRANK C. HULSE, PLS 6498: Mr. Hulse entered into a Stipulated Agreement with the State Board on September 6, 2002. He acknowledged that he violated the provisions of NAC 625.670, NAC 625.690, NAC 625.710 and NAC 625.410(2) when he failed to perform a diligent search of pertinent records; failed to determine the most probable location of corner positions; failed to properly communicate with his clients concerning boundary lines of right of way issues; and failed to identify all monuments found. **License was suspended for two years with the suspension stayed, placed on two years' probation, and required to reimburse his client the sum of \$1,700.**

THOMAS J. KOCINSKI, CE/SE 10486: Mr. Kocinski performed engineering services in the State of Nevada after his license had lapsed in violation of NRS 625.520(1)(b) and NRS 625.410(5)(7). **Fined \$500.**

DAVID A. RICHARDS, PLS 10026: Mr. Richards entered into a Stipulated Agreement with the State Board on September 11, 2003. He acknowledged that he violated NAC 625.630 and NAC 625.410(2)(5) when he advertised and offered to perform professional civil engineering services in the State of Nevada without employing a full-time Nevada licensed civil engineer. **Agreed to Cease & Desist, pay an administrative fine of \$500, and pay the investigative cost of \$500.**

EDWARD F. TANEY, CE 9903: Mr. Taney entered into a Stipulated Agreement with the State Board on May 9, 2003. He acknowledged that he violated the provisions of NAC 625.510 when he was disciplined by the Clark County District Court for violating the Court's Order in the case of GVS, Incorporated, dba Alpha Engineering, Plaintiff v. Edward F. Taney, et al.

In resolving the disciplinary action, Mr. Taney represented to the Board that he personally has not, nor would he, process a subdivision plat or other professional document without first obtaining the written consent of the professional who had prepared that document, and that he will place that caveat in the employment policy manual of his firm, Taney Engineering. **Issued a Public Reprimand and required to take and successfully complete the Texas Tech University, Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, Basic Studies in Engineering Ethics Correspondence Course.**

ALI R. TOGHANIPOUR, CE 13986: Mr. Toghanipour Stipulated on September 11, 2003, that he placed his license on the wall of Mr. Bourmaian's office, entered into a fee sharing agreement with Mr. Bourmaian, and assisted David Richards and Civilwise Services, LLC to advertise and offer to perform professional civil engineering, thus violating NAC 625.630 and NRS 625.410(2)(3)(5).

Placed on probation for a period of two years, pay an administrative fine of \$1,000, pay investigative costs of \$2,000, agreed to refrain from aiding and abetting the unlicensed practice of civil engineering, agreed to refrain from assisting non-licensed individuals to advertise that they or their firm can perform professional engineering services, and will take and successfully complete the Texas Tech University, Murdough Center for Engineering Professionalism, Basic Studies in Engineering Ethics Correspondence Course.

GERNOT UEBLACKER, NON-LICENSEE: The Board issued a Decision and Order against Mr. Ueblacker on February 7, 2003. Mr. Ueblacker is licensed in the State of Colorado but is not, and has never been, licensed as a professional engineer in the State of Nevada. In the summer of 2002, Mr. Ueblacker stamped and signed a submittal made on a project located in the State of Nevada using a stamp which stated that he was licensed as a professional engineer in the State of Nevada. The stamp signed by Mr. Ueblacker had a license number of another civil engineer licensed in the State of Nevada who had not authorized and was unaware of Mr. Ueblacker's use of his stamp and license number. There was substantial and persuasive evidence on record to support a violation of NRS 625.520(1)(a)(c)(e)(g). **Assessed a civil penalty of \$15,000, issued a Cease & Desist Order.**

BRIAN L. WARD, SE 5964: Mr. Ward acknowledged through a Stipulated Agreement on March 13, 2003, that he violated NRS 625.520(1)(b) and NRS 625.410(5)(7) when he performed professional engineering services in the State of Nevada after his license had lapsed. **Paid an administrative fine of \$1,000.**

LETTER OF CONCERN: *This is not ordinarily a sanction. It is an expression of disapproval and warning or advisement that an activity is not appropriate. It is kept in the licensee's file and becomes an aggravating factor should the particular behavior continue.*

No letters of concern were issued during the time period of this newsletter.

LETTER OF CAUTION: *This is not a sanction. It is an expression of warning or advisement that an activity is not appropriate. It is kept in the licensee's file and becomes an aggravating factor should the particular behavior continue.*

Two letters of caution were issued to licensees for receiving disciplinary actions against them in other states. The Board may take disciplinary action against any licensee who is disciplined by another state if at least one of the grounds for discipline is the same or substantially equivalent to any ground contained in Chapter 625 of the Nevada Revised Statutes. Letters of Caution are only issued for minor violations.

CEASE & DESIST ORDERS: *This is an order of an administrative agency or court prohibiting a person or business firm from continuing a particular course of conduct.*

One Cease and Desist Order was issued to an individual who was using the title "P.E." on his business card without being properly licensed in the State of Nevada.
